



Silver Ray Jewell Award for Services to the NAA

At the 2003 annual general meeting of the NAA, John Hope was bestowed the Silver Ray Jewell Award. John has been a member of council since 1997, from 1999 vice president and a member of the editorial team. He chairs the highly important Victoria Museum sub-committee.

John was chairman of one of Australia's most successful superannuation boards and his professional expertise has benefited our association immeasurably. John offers investment guidance and provides valuable assistance to our secretary and treasurer. For six issues of our journal as assistant editor, John has made available his numismatic expertise and depth of knowledge of Australiana.

His most significant role is that of chairman on the Museum Victoria sub-committee, a committee formed in response to the museum's move at modernising its services to the public and in the process downgrading the numismatic collection and facilities. One positive result of these ongoing meetings is that the museum is now processing the numismatic collection to make it available on-line.

John is only the second person presented with the Silver Ray Jewell Medal, the first having been awarded posthumously to Ray Jewell, founder of the NAA.
