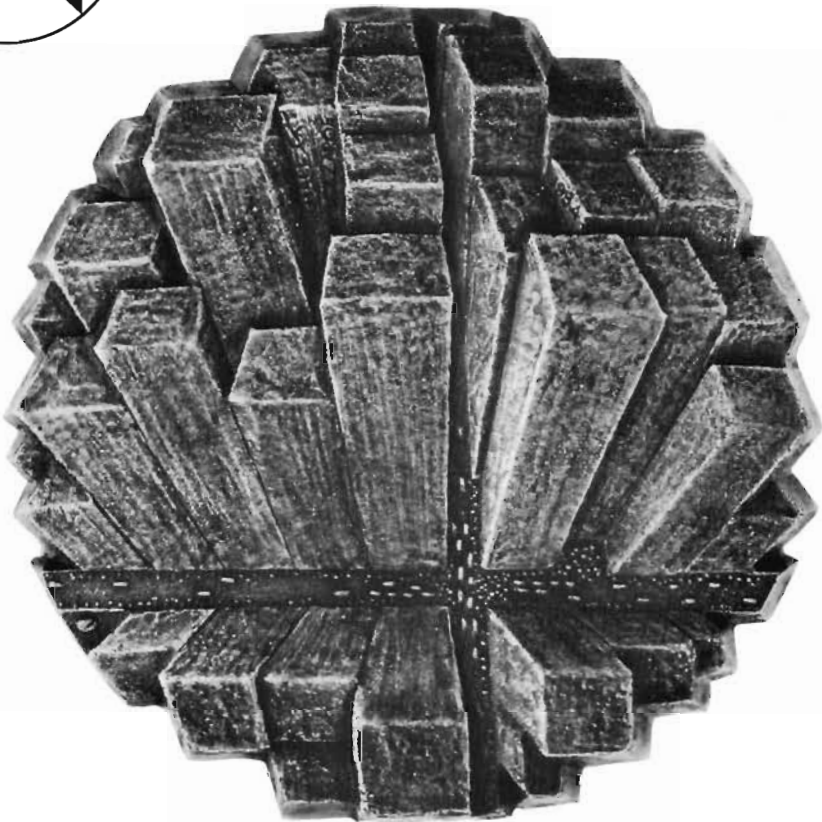

CATALOGUE OF COINS, MEDALS & CHECKS IN THE A. M. LE SOUEF COLLECTION

Introduction

The hand written catalogue of the collection formed by A. M. Le Souef, Deputy Master of the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint from 1919 to 1926, is held by the Museum of Victoria. Le Souef's collection is of great importance but, as the catalogue has not been published, exactly what was, or was not in it has not been generally known. A result of this is that many coins are incorrectly ascribed to him. Over the years coins described verbally as "possibly from the Le Souef collection" have come to be published as "from the Le Souef collection". This is usually in error.

An additional source of confusion arises from the popular view that he had a "number two collection". This is partly true but again, over the years seems to have become far larger than it was. Its origin lies with Sydney Hagley of Adelaide who purchased what has come to be called the "number two collection".

Fortunately, Hagley discussed the Le Souef collection in a letter to Erich Wodak in November 1956. He wrote "Le Souef offered me the collection which the Gallery afterwards bought, for £ 400, but at the time I could not

afford them. This lot included the restrike of the Adelaide Five Pound in gold and silver, the 1919 1/-, the CuNi patterns etc. These latter items he had in duplicate and I bought them later but always regret not having found the £400!!"

It seems therefore that the "number two collection" was only of the 1919 to 1921 nickel patterns. The "number one collection" is detailed in the catalogue published below. Editorial comment has been added in the form of footnotes. Unhappily, some of the Le Souef coins were missing from the collection when it was transferred to the Museum in 1976.

The importance of the Le Souef collection lies in the man and his position as Deputy Master of the Melbourne Mint, not its size or scope. Le Souef played a major role in the production of some of Australia's most interesting coins. Some of these may since have been chosen as suitable subjects for the forger's art.

Le Souef was not a wealthy collector. He collected one of each of the higher denominations but two of each denomination below sixpence. Extension, even to this, did not occur until he was appointed to the Deputy Master position.

Nos 1 to 8 & 10 Models were made by Douglas Richardson. Reductions made by Stokes & Son, who prepared and lettered dies.

Nos. 9 & 11 Dies engraved in the Royal Mint. London.

1. The gold and silver strikes were made at the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint in 1921.
2. Missing in 1976 stocktake. One of three restrikes of 1926.
3. Le Souef supervised the striking of this issue. He obtained the last coin struck at the Sydney Mint for himself.
4. One of three struck at the closure of the Sydney Mint in 1926. The other two were for William Dixon and the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint.
5. Le Souef considered that there were only two types of penny in 1919, five in 1920 (including the raised tail) and two in 1921. He makes no comment on variations of weight. No official reference to strikings other than in nickel have been uncovered.

10. Le Souef must have known of the two pair of star patterns retained by the Melbourne Mint, and of the two pair sent to the Royal Mint, London. Another pair was in the Hagley Collection and one must suspect that Le Souef supplied it to Hagley or his source. He may not have been aware of the pair struck in London and retained by the Royal Mint there. In this context it is unclear what he meant by "Unique".
11. Although this entry is in Le Souef's hand, the colour of the ink suggests a later entry than the rest of the line (perhaps as late as 1926, see note 17 below). The entry here may have been an error, perhaps it was intended for the 1922/1 overdate two lines below. However, even this would not have explained his use of the word "unique" as the Chitty specimen was already in the Gallery collection in 1923. Unfortunately, both the Chitty and Le Souef specimens were missing in the 1976 stocktake.
12. This is an important entry. The Chitty specimen, see note 11, although known earlier, was from a private collection. This piece and description are from the Deputy Master of the mint at which the coins were struck. Le Souef's statement "last 2 over 1" suggests that we are not dealing with a chance die crack as is often suggested.
13. The word "Sydney" is pencilled in by Le Souef, not written in ink as the rest of the catalogue.
14. This entry has been corrected from "1922".
15. Struck at the Melbourne Mint, hence not attributed to a mint.

16. The remarks adjacent to the 1924 coinage should be read: Melbourne Mint Date inserted for first time on all dies this year at Melbourne¹⁷.
17. The ink used for the 1925 and 1926 entries is darker and uniform. It gives the appearance of a single entry time and corresponds with the colour of the entry for the 1926 Sydney Mint sovereign on page 2.
18. Written in a different colour ink to the 1925-26 entries.
19. Written in a different colour ink to the 1927 entries. Le Souef did not obtain an example of the 1928 halfpenny which was struck at the Melbourne Mint. It was presumably struck after he stopped collecting. During the first part of 1928 the Melbourne Mint struck halfpence using 1927 dated dies, hence the relative scarcity of the 1928 halfpenny compared to the mintage figure for this denomination that year.
